2. Resumes of the principal persons to be involved with this project are attached.
3. The subject of this research project is to be the remains of an at present unidentified 18th century vessel or vessels together with adjacent dockage, mooring, and disposal areas containing pertinent artifactual materials relating to military, naval, and trade activities in the Lake Ontario-St. Lawrence area.
4. The location of these features is at and about the head of Carleton Island including areas known historically as Merchant's Cove, Schank's Bay (North Bay), and Government Bay (South Bay). See attached Great Lake Survey Chart No. 17 with indicated coordinates and area indicated by shading to be covered by permit.
5. Excavation and recovery techniques for initial stages of project operation are indicated in the attached report prepared by the project director, Peter B. Perrault.

6. Official arrangements have been completed through the Thousand Islands State Park and Recreation Commission for the use of Burnham Point State Park for dockage of research vessels and equipment.
7. Work related to the project will be conducted at two locations, the archeological site and the Underwater Preservation Laboratory at Sackets Harbor Battlefield. Underwater mapping, photography, and temporary preservation of artifacts will be conducted at the site while long-term preservation, detailed photography, and study will be performed at the State's Sackets Harbor facility. Archeological methods and technical expertise will be approved or supplied by the designated representatives of the Thousand Islands and Central New York State Park and Recreation Commissions on behalf of the Division for Historic Preservation. As property of the State of New York, recovered artifacts will become part of the historical collections of the Division for Historic Preservation.
8. Artifacts and any other recovered materials will be utilized for purposes of research and interpretation at museum properties and historic sites of the Division for Historic Preservation, particularly Fort Ontario and Sackets Harbor Battlefield; however, duplicate or other materials not required for the Division's programs may be made available upon proper application to the Division for short-term loans to other recognized museums and historical agencies in accordance with standard policy.
9. It is presently anticipated that active site work on this project will be conducted from March, 1974 through November, 1976.
